

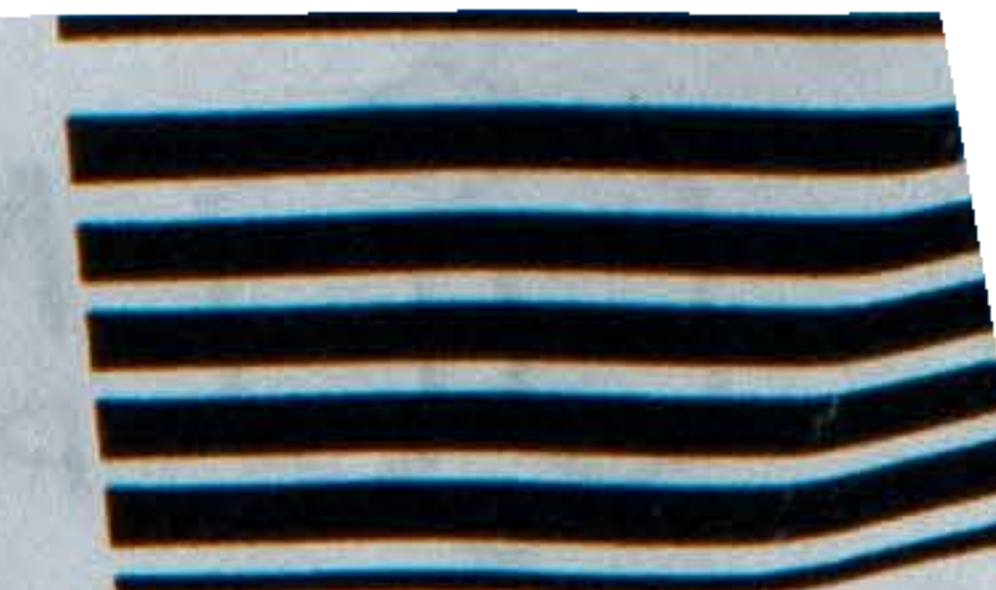

ABOUT THIS MEDICATION

CONTENT OF THE PACK

Of the 298.5 tons of morphine-equivalent opioids distributed globally per year (2010-2013 average), only 0.1 tons are distributed in low-income countries.

Latin American and Caribbean countries use less than 2% of the world's opioids.

A patient in need of palliative care requires an average of 500mg of morphine per year.

99% of needs are not met in Haiti.

In Canada, there is an excess of 13.600%.

US\$0.47 is the price of 10 mg of oral/solid morphine. In low-income countries, that price is 5.8 times more.

WARNINGS AND PRECAUTIONS

In a 2013 study carried out in San Nicolás, Buenos Aires Province, Argentina, it was found that even though it is a country with medium and high incomes, Argentina has only 30.77% availability of opioids. The same study was carried out in different countries, some with economic characteristics similar to those of Argentina, such as Brazil and Uruguay.

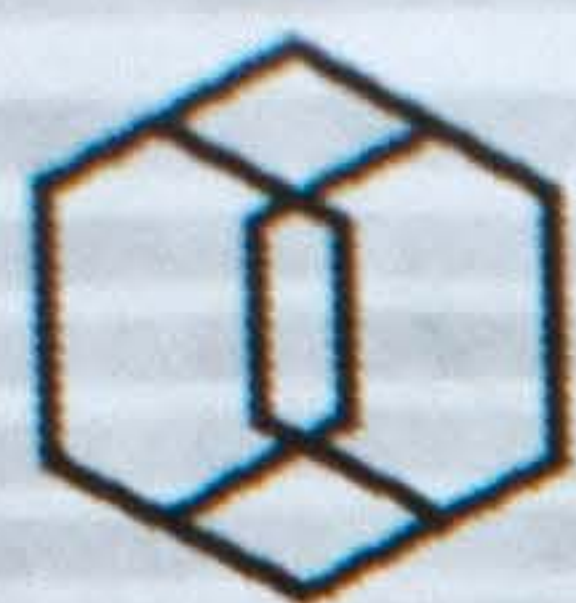
INTERACTIONS WITH THE MEDICATION

The 67th World Health Assembly established "how urgent it is to include palliative care in the entire care process, particularly at the level of primary health care."

The Assembly urged Member States:

- 1) to develop, strengthen and implement, where appropriate, palliative care policies to support the comprehensive strengthening of health systems, (...) with emphasis on primary care, community and home-based care, and universal coverage schemes;
- 2) to ensure adequate domestic funding and allocation of human resources, as appropriate, for palliative care initiatives;
- 3) to aim to include palliative care as an integral component of the ongoing education and training offered to care providers.

PROPER USE OF THIS MEDICATION

A Hospice functions as a place where people with advanced or terminal illnesses go to live their last days, undergoing an "end of life" process.

Those who are admitted at the Hospice are called Guests and there are no limitations on money, age, gender or religion. The only requirement is to have an advanced illness that has no treatment and a short life expectancy (the average stay in the San Camilo Hospice of the Province of Buenos Aires is around 24 days).

Guests are treated for pain, both physical and mental. Poor, homeless and people with no families have priority. There is no charge for staying in the house. Hospices in Argentina are NGOs which can operate thanks to donations and the unconditional work of volunteers (there are around 200 at San Camilo Hospice).

The Hospice movement was born in England in 1967 thanks to Cecily Saunders, a nurse who realized that dying people needed a special place different from what a hospital could offer. A safe place where people could be treated for their physical and emotional pains when there is no longer a cure for their illness.

MORE INFORMATION

Volunteers are essential to carrying out hospice care. Without them, it would not be possible to provide guests with the physical, mental and spiritual well-being they need; this both inside and outside the Hospice, in their hospital and home visits. Volunteers do not receive any salary for their work.

THE END OF LIFE SHOULDN'T BE TABOO

All Hospices in Argentina receive donations to be able to support themselves and continue helping those who need it.
